$>$ Examples:

| English | - Canada |
| :--- | :--- |
| Layan | - Sunday |

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One and More Than One

* A noun/ naming word that names one person, place or thing is called a singular noun.
$>$ Examples:
- apple
- lizard
- baby
- rock

A noun/ naming word that names more than one is called plural noun. You can add -s or -es to form more than one.
Add -es if the word ends in $s, s s, c h, s h, x$ and $z$.
$>$ Examples:
$\begin{array}{ll}\text { - } & \text { tree - trees } \\ \text { - } & \text { glass - glasses }\end{array} \quad$ - boys $\quad$ bench - benches
